What is it?

An exhilarating day of action and espionage activities, designed to give guests a taste of being James Bond.

Whether you wish to avoid enemy fire using a high speed vehicle or scour the land from the skies, The Name's Bond is a unique event able to be tailored around your needs. The event is equally as effective as a motivational day or as a team building opportunity.

A day with a real license to thrill...

How does it work?

Leonard Bivevski, the infamous international arms dealer, has stolen the "key" to MI6's computer network - giving him full access to the locations and identities of all of Britain's secret agents. He will no doubt sell this key to the highest bidder, thus proving catastrophic for national security.

The Director General of MI6, 'M', has arranged an emergency training day. Since the identities of current '00' agents have been compromised, the agency must employ the help of new recruits in retrieving the 'key' and thwarting potential disaster. This training day will decide which team of agents are most adept to tackle the mission.

At the start of the training day, there can be a staged 'storming'; with various secret agent characters arriving in motorised vehicles and helicopters, armed with impressive weaponry. The character of 'M' makes an entrance after the agents declare the area 'safe', alongside an assortment of 'Bond girls/boys' - who can mix and mingle with guests throughout the day.

M will brief the group on the situation and split them into teams. The guests will then be sent to tackle a range of different training activities and challenges. Instructors/agents in camouflage or spy gear will be on hand to assist the teams in each challenge zone.

The day is flexible and you can choose as many challenge zones as you want, with activities tailored to your audience and event requirements.

Example challenge zones:

Pilots Under Fire

Using high powered off-road buggies, budding agents will negotiate a testing course. To examine reactions and driving skills, they will come under fire from paintball guns held by their co-agents. The trainee with the least splattered vehicle at the end of the course will claim the title of best driver.

Heli-Reconnaissance


The ability to quickly identify critical details will be required for spy missions. Teams test their observation skills when flown over a field in a helicopter.

Crossbow

An elite agent should be a master marksman. To improve hand-eye coordination and shooting accuracy, teams are challenged to fire a crossbow at different ranged targets.

Hovers

There is a strong chance that the mission will require you to enter enemy bases via waterways. Therefore, 'M' needs to know whether your team have the skill level to handle a single seater hovercraft.



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Quads – Rapid Response Vehicles

If undertaking the mission on unforgiving terrain, field operatives will need to be able to control these off road rapid response vehicles.

Inflatables

An expert agent needs to possess great strength and agility when faced with one-on-one confrontation and escape situations. The teams' skills can be tested on choice of inflatable challenges including bungee run, bouncy boxing, pedestal joust, bog ski race and more...

Bomb Disposal

There's a good chance that explosives will have to be defused during any spy mission. In this training zone, the teams' mental capabilities of problem solving and deciphering will be tested.

A myriad of other agent challenges are also available, with various shooting activities testing teams' accuracy and response, a collection of military skills challenges to hone the budding spies' formidability, and numerous team work challenges to examine team cohesion – vital for success in a mission. After all challenges have been undertaken, 'M' gathers the teams back together, presents awards for the top performances in each activity and declares the overall winning team – the members of which are now classed fully fledged 'Agents', ready to take on Bivevski and save the country...

- Include 'heavy armour' training for agents with tank driving challenges
- Have your secret agents arrive in style with stretched Limos
- Increase the glamour and style of your event by using professional models or actors as 'Bond girls' and 'Bond boys'
- Include the Bond character 'Q' - who can host a gadgets display. Some of these gadgets could then be given to teams for use in some challenges – perhaps night vision goggles worn during a helicopter reconnaissance mission?
- Finish the day with a themed Bond evening, complete with tuxedos, ball gowns, casino tables, cocktails and '00' awards for performances throughout the day
