

Military Action Day (MAD)

What is it?

An adventurous, adrenaline charged event.

"Stand to attention you 'orrible lot!"

Welcome to the Military Action Day; all the fun of the forces, with none of the drawbacks. We have military activities to put you through your paces. You reckon you can cut it? The demands are high, but the rewards are exceptional.

"Ok then. Get out there and give me 100%. Dismissed!"

How does it work?

Divided into teams, guests take part in a number of outdoor military activities. A competitive element can be introduced, with teams scored on their performance in each activity. Prior to the event, guests can be given a list of equipment to bring, rendezvous co-ordinates and instructions in the form of call-up papers.

Arriving at a security gate, 'army personnel' can scan vehicles for anything untoward, and examine call up papers before letting the vehicles through.

Upon registration, guests are given their military issue, asked to hand over their 'civvies', and change into their army fatigues before the activities begin. The Military Action Day is completely flexible, and you can choose the activities to suit your audience and requirements.

Military Activities

Argos

Guests can speed easily across unforgiving landscapes in Argocats. These 6 wheeled semi-amphibious machines are used as reconnaissance vehicles by the Canadian army. Able to cross any off road terrain, they demand a high level of co-ordination and control.

Close Quarter Battle

Using paintball guns, recruits take part in a simulated battle.

After a briefing and some combat planning, teams use their guns and paint grenades to do battle. Missions can include 'capture the flag', 'protect the president' and 'base raid'.

At the end of the battle, paint-spattered casualties are counted and a debrief session will evaluate the strengths and weaknesses of the teams' battle plans and execution.

For a less physical battle, laser alternatives can be provided.

Fire Arms Training

Teams examine a whole range of weapons, from World War I to the modern day with our armory expert. Having completed the theory, teams are taught how to use a shotgun and a crossbow under the watchful eye of the instructor. Also available are rifles, pistols, muskets and many more.

Helicopter Reconnaissance

Observation and memory are put to the test during this flight of a lifetime. To save their troops, teams spot and memorise the position of various objects across the countryside and report their findings upon return.

With the pressure on, will your reconnaissance provide accurate information?

Military Armour

A chance to experience the ultimate vehicular encounter, just choose one or more of the following:

Chieftain Tank - 55 tonnes of armoured might, able to tackle rough terrain effortlessly. Perhaps perform a car-crushing finale with it?

Abbot Tank - A 17 tonne gun tank which is fast and highly maneuverable.

Ferret – Nippy, responsive and with an unusual driving position, Ferrets can be great fun to drive in deep mud!

Lance Missile Carrier - A massive tracked vehicle which is able to climb nearly anything.

Haugglund Bv206 - Simple to drive and using an automatic gearbox, a Bv206 can be fully amphibious and also has off road capabilities.

FV 432 - The 432 can reach off road speeds of over 30 mph. It has served as everything from a battlefield van to a minelayer, rocket launcher, troop carrier and mortar firer.

Humvee -A huge off-roader, deep wading vehicle seating 4. Highly powerful - aural protection is recommended!

Military Minefield

Blindfolded team members are guided through a corridor filled with trip wires at various heights and angles by their team mates. The wires are attached to bells - one single noise can alert the enemy and place your squad in danger!

This makes a great head to head team game. The first to the finish wins!

Mortar Team

The objective is to destroy an enemy supply dump using the unique mortar system. Communication is the key to success as the firing team works with an observation team using flag signals to correct the mortar trajectory and hit the target.

SAS Skills

Teams receive special operations training. Professionals and former members of the SAS teach the budding soldiers how to live off the land and survive behind enemy lines. The art of camouflage is explained, as well as counter surveillance techniques, bomb disposal, field craft and unarmed combat. After a period of training teams can demonstrate what they have learnt during a simulated training exercise.

Tank Stalk

Tank hunting or stalking is the infantry's special contribution to the anti-tank battle. Using a steel lance projectile system, recruits hit a series of knock down tank targets, which explode with amazing pyrotechnics.

The fire team will be supported by an ammunition team who carry the shell canister containing the steel lance projectiles. Team members rotate roles so that everyone has the chance to destroy some enemy armour.

Target Grenades

Using a replica training grenade, recruits hit a series of targets at various distances. A successful throw will detonate a battlefield pyrotechnic. As if that wasn't exciting enough, grenades are thrown from standing and prone positions after a crawl through a net tunnel.

Battle Finale

You can finish your event with a paintball battle finale featuring a number of vehicles used throughout the day. Thrilling and hugely enjoyable, this is great way for guests to make use of everything they have learned.
